The Regional Economic Growth Through Innovation offers funding through Regional Economic Development Agencies:

The Business Scale-up and Productivity stream offers funding to help businesses to accelerate their growth and assists with the adoption of innovative technologies that support scale-up, productivity and global competitiveness as well as the development of and entry into new markets. Funding under this stream provides no-interest, repayable contributions from \$500,000 up to \$10 million to businesses.

The Regional Innovation Ecosystems stream helps create, grow and develop strong and inclusive regional networks that support business growth and innovation. It also fosters the entrepreneurial environment necessary for more innovative regional economies and increases the competitiveness of small and medium-sized enterprises, women entrepreneurs and under-represented groups.
